This week, Aya and Maisie have worked collaboratively to carry out some research at home and produced a PowerPoint to share with the class. The PowerPoint is going on display in the classroom and already several children have asked if they can read it.



Belle and Phoenix have also enjoyed doing some extra research at home. Belle made a model of the Mayflower including sails and presented her ship with a piece of research she had typed up and printed.
