Our new RE Learning Question is - Why is Easter special for Christians?

Here are our end of unit Learning Outcomes:

- Recognise and retell stories connected with the celebration of Easter
- Say why Easter is a special time for Christians
- Talk about ideas of new life in nature
- Recognise some symbols Christians use during Holy Week, e.g. palm leaves, cross, eggs, etc., and make connections with signs of new life in nature
- Talk about some ways Christians remember these stories at Easter.

Task 1 - Look out of your window or go for a short walk to look for signs of spring (daffodils, primroses, buds on trees, lambs in the field etc). Can you draw pictures and label what you see? Talk about how Spring is the time when things start to grow (new life).

Perhaps you could plant some seeds in your own garden/ in pots on your window sill and watch them grow over the coming weeks?

Could you record your observations through photographs or drawings?

Task 2 - Watch the video of the Easter Story and discuss with your family. How do you celebrate Easter? Think about what you do and why.
