This year is the 400-year anniversary of the sailing of the Mayflower from Plymouth in Devon to Plymouth in America. In recognition of this event, our first Learning Journey question of the term is, 'What can we learn from the voyage of the Mayflower and from the people who sailed on her?'

It really was amazing and it has already led to some 'exciting writing'. Our class competition to come up with fantastic words and phrases to really bring to life the conditions on board the ship was narrowly won by Team Townsend (but well done to everyone for your exceptionally creative thinking!)
